


Modern Slavery Statement 2019-20

Our supply chain

Over 20,000 products



We stock a huge amount of building materials. Most of these are sourced through Fortis, an industry buying group. Suppliers are reviewed and approved before joining Fortis.

We've reviewed the key areas where there is a risk of modern slavery practices.

Risk	Assessment	Response
Seasonal work	Low	We do not have a seasonal work force
Complex business	Low	Our group structure is simple, meaning that our senior team is close to our working practices across the group
High risk countries	Low	We do not source goods or services from high risk countries
Complex supply chain	Low	Our supply chains are not very complex
High risk suppliers	Low	Approximately 75% of our products are sourced through Fortis, an industry buying group with approved suppliers
Timber procurement	Low	We do import timber and we comply with leading certification schemes. This ensures that timber comes from a responsibly managed forest. We train our teams on remaining compliant with this and are audited to ensure that we're following the correct procedures.
